Mr. Kistler reported the new High School Principal will be Shane Kelley. Mrs. Harms, Mrs. Markus, and Mr. Kistler met with the Widefield School District Board. They would like to meet with them every other year, so the two School Boards will know one another. Mrs. Harms, Mrs. Markus, Mr. Kistler and Mr. Land took a tour of Widefield's Grand Mountain Elementary. Mr. Kistler stated it gave the board a good idea of what a K-8 school would look like. End of Year activities are ramping up. Mr. Kistler is driving a bus for the district the first two weeks in May for the morning and afternoon routes. He and Mr. Lessig are discussing possible adjustments for next years' routes. He would like to schedule a Work Session with the Board to discuss the direction for Grandview. - During the April 1st staff in-service, Deb Pope completed the three part executive functioning training with the teachers
 and paraprofessionals. The training has had a positive impact on student organization and performance. The training's easy
 to follow three step organizational approach made teaching student organizational skills clear and effective. Many of the
 teachers were implementing the approach the very next day.
- CMAS testing occurred from March 29 through April 14. Grades three through six completed three units of math and three
 units of language arts. The fifth grade also completed three units of science. Absent students will be able to make up any
 missing units through April 28th.
- The preschool through 2nd grades will participate in an Easter egg hunt on April 20th.
- The final Friday Enrichment day is scheduled for April 22nd. Nine activities will be offered and will cover preschool
 through sixth grade. Activities will be taught by elementary and middle/high school staff as well as community volunteers.
 High school student volunteers usually assist and can earn hours toward NHS.
- End of the year academic benchmark assessments will start on April 26th.
- On April 28th the elementary will host the 1st and 2nd grade spring concert. The first performance will happen at 2:30 for the other elementary students. The second performance is scheduled for 5:30 in the evening. Parents are welcome to attend either concert

National Honor Students will be at the elementary tomorrow, April 20th to hide the Easter eggs for the elementary students. NHS also helps with Friday Enrichments at the elementary school.

I would like to welcome the new principal at Peyton Jr.-Sr. High School, Mr. Shane Kelley. After an extensive hiring and shadowing process, Mr. Kelley was offered the position last week, and gladly accepted. We are excited to welcome him to the Peyton School District! Mr. Kelley has 22 years of experience in public education, and a passion and dedication to rural students and schools. 3. Peyton Online Academy-

Peyton Online Academy (POA) Elementary

There are 4 students enrolled in the elementary POA. One is excelling, one is on track, and two are struggling. The instructors have worked closely with the two struggling students. One comes in each week to receive support and the other is about 6 weeks behind in each subject. The student has until May 1st to finish completing missing assignments before they are converted to zero. She will likely be coming back to in-person schooling next year. The students will come to PES for CMAS testing the week of the 18th.

B. District Maintenance Report-

Board Update April 2022

- Master Plan information is provided in a separate email. Much of the information is the same as the work session, I wanted to make sure you had everything in one place.
- Some HVAC, roof and septic issues continue. As you know, the HS gym HVAC unit went down the day of the last board meeting. HS Mod 5 furnace went out on the morning of 4/4/22 (back up and running by 11:00). BCU-08 at the ES has not failed since 04:11 on 3/16/22, then failed at 01:48 on 4/13/22. Boiler # 2 at the elementary school is failing intermittently, trying to schedule Black Hills Energy to be here at the same time as the HVAC contractor. RTU-02 at the HS has been going into alarm multiple times, we have been unable to determine the cause. Trane tech was on-site and was unable to find the problem. The unit resets and functions properly. Tech suggested waiting until the problem gets worse or the unit fails, then call them back.
- No further alarms at the high school fire panel, the door holder at the gym appears to have been the issue.
- A rough month in the elementary kitchen, warmer is still not functioning properly (old and beyond repair), milk cooler went down (lost 7 cases of chocolate milk), freezer went down and needed multiple service calls and the steam table (heated serving table) lost one of the four sections. When I called the manufacturer of the steam table to get parts, they didn't recognize the model and serial number, "it is missing two more digits". It is too old for them and all of my contacts to find parts and the same for CCK Mechanical Services and their parts suppliers. On 4/13/22 another section of the steam table is not heating properly. Fortunately Cora caught the freezer quickly and our food losses are under \$200.00.
- We are still working to complete all the corrections from the State Fire Inspections. They informed me there will be follow up inspections to confirm compliance, we probably will not get a heads up that they are coming. The quote for doors and hardware to replace the scissor gate near the south wing of CTEF was \$4,861.00, that is with us doing the installation and door frames already in place. The other locations do not have doorways framed in. We were looking for other options but with no money for capital improvements this summer we will have to operate without the gates / doors.
- CTEF north bathrooms have been placed out of service a couple of times due to blockages.
- Rental house is almost ready for new tenants.
- · Still no updates on annual health inspections.
- Waste Water Treatment Plant is in compliance, retesting lowered our monthly average below the required levels. No significant leaks and plant is functioning.
- C. District Advisory-no meeting. DAC is the community group that helps the board with the direction of what is happening. They review policies as well as send staff surveys for the Board to get input. The April meeting was cancelled due to the passing of Pam Dawson. She will be greatly missed. DAC charges will be approved in May. The staff survey will go with May meetings and charges to the Board.

- D. JL-JS CASB Revisions- Mr. Rea stated that these policies were boilerplate, and the changes made were formatting. Mrs. Harms made the motion to approve Policies JL-JS (CASB Revisions). Mrs. Cavanagh seconded the motion. All Board Members present voted "aye". The motion passed.
- E. New Curriculum Approval-Elementary Reading Curriculum-The new curriculum has been on display for a month at the elementary. Mrs. Markus did review it and nothing stood out. The Board discussing the different options for shipping. Mrs. Harms made the motion to approve the New Elementary Reading Curriculum. Mrs. Markus seconded the motion. All Board Members present voted "aye". The motion passed.
- F. Policy IMB-Teaching Controversial Issues-2nd Reading- The Board discussed this item during a Work Session. They have no concerns regarding updated wording. Mr. Harms made the motion to approve Policy IMB-Teaching Controversial Issues. Mrs. Cavanagh seconded the motion. All Board Members present voted "aye". The motion passed.
